Asia Bibi, the Pakistani Christian on Death Row, since being sentenced to death in 2010 for blasphemy.

**Those in need:** Those being cared for in local hospitals, hospices and nursing homes. For all who are ill, especially for: Louise Singleton, Mary Brooks, Winnie Horrobin, Irene Ellison, Adrian Atkinson, Louise Rostron, Brian Martin, Sharon McDowell and Audrey Downes.
