As we continue to implement our Mission Action Plan, we pray that we will grow numerically, in faith and in discipleship. We pray that all of us might be good witnesses to the love of Christ in our day-to-day lives and that our footprint in the community might grow. We pray that our uniformed organisations, ABC, and Sunday School will continue to thrive and that Messy Church will grow. We ask for discernment as we explore additional possibilities for serving the young people of this parish.

<u>Our finances</u>: Future building work as we prepare to apply for Heritage Lottery Funding. That we will meet our obligation to the Diocese to cover the cost of ministry in this parish and to support the cost of mission within the Diocese generally through the Parish Share.

<u>Our families, friends, and our local community</u>: Those facing financial or other difficulties. Those who are lonely or homeless. Those struggling with addiction. Those who care for the frail and sick. Those living on Starling Road.

<u>Our nation & the world:</u> The Queen, her Ministers, our MP (Ivan Lewis), our councillors (Sharon Briggs, Peter Bury & Jane Lewis). Those affected by war and conflict. The persecuted Church, especially Christians in Sudan, Kenya, Nigeria, Pakistan, Iraq and Syria. Asia Bibi, the Pakistani Christian on Death Row, since being sentenced to death in 2010 for blasphemy.

Those in need: Those being cared for in local hospitals, hospices and nursing homes. For all who are ill, especially for: Louise Singleton, Mary Brooks, Winnie Horrobin, Irene Ellison, Adrian Atkinson, Louise Rostron, Brian Martin, Audrey Downes and Leslie Holden.

<u>The bereaved</u>: All who have lost loved ones, especially the family and friends of Joyce Cabble, Bridget Mary Partington, and Sharon McDowell. Trusting in God, may they find healing, peace, strength and courage to face the future.

PCC News

The PCC met on 27th January and the matters discussed included: our link with St John's, Olafu (in Kenya); the proposed Ainsworth and Radcliffe Team; youth work; the Child Friendly Church Award (a small working party was established to check our progress in achieving this); and the news that Debra will be attending a Bishops' Advisory Panel conference in May to determine whether she will be selected for ordination training. We also discussed fundraising for our new pew cushions (see separate notice), the Flower Festival and began to consider some other possible events to celebrate our 500th anniversary. There is no news yet regarding Revd Elaine's licensing and there is good news from English Heritage who have told us that we are eligible to bid for Heritage Lottery Funding towards the cost of repointing the church stonework and stabilising the South wall (there is no guarantee, however, that our bid will be successful so please continue to hold this in your prayers).

- Food & Fellowship is the working title for a group of volunteers from local churches seeking to help refugees and asylum seekers in the South of the borough by offering them food and fellowship. They are hoping to arrange a one-off event (maybe followed by more) and are seeking volunteers. A planning meeting for those interested will take place 7pm, 10th February at St Thomas & St John's, Radcliffe.
- Volunteers: we are seeking additional helpers to assist at Baptisms; and more volunteers to lead our prayers at our 10.30am services and, especially, at our 6.30pm services. Please speak with Revd Dave in confidence if you feel God is calling you to any of these important roles.
- 500th anniversary: as part of the festivities (and for your comfort in the years to come) the PCC has decided to introduce Pew Cushions for all downstairs pews. The cost will be just over £4,000 and we are now seeking donations (no matter how small).
